Strategic Disaster Planning for Native American Communities and Housing Programs Virtual Training

TRAINING

This training will focus on how to develop and implement a disaster plan to prepare for future emergency events, such as disasters, to help ensure a favorable response. The training will define “risk” versus “hazard” and the process to develop a risk assessment based on capacity and need. The training will discuss the four phases of disaster planning including mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery, and will include a brief discussion of using strategic planning as a tool for this purpose.
