She played a key role during the transition from the 1937 Act to the NAHASDA Act of 1996. As CEO of the largest tribal housing entity, she has enhanced housing access, streamlined project expenditures, ensured federal compliance, and implemented leveraged funding strategies.

Cheryl is an enrolled member of the Bay Mills Tribe of Chippewa Indians and served as their Housing Director for 28+ years. She also proudly served as Chairwoman of the National American Indian Housing Council from May 2010 to May 2014, and also as the Secretary and Vice-Chair from 1998-2010. On the regional level, she served as the Chairwoman of the Great Lakes Indian Housing Association, representing 31 Housing Entities around the Great Lakes-Eastern Woodlands area, for seven Years. Ms. Causley is now the Principal of Cheryl A Causley and Associates who offers housing consulting and management services.
