#### **TRAINER**

Maria Tagliavento, CPA—Maria has over 40 years of accounting and management experience and a practitioner's perspective ranging from auditing experience with Coopers & Lybrand Accounting Firm to Chief Financial Officer (CFO) and Executive Vice President for Cook Inlet Housing Authority (CIHA), a TDHE in Anchorage, Alaska. Maria joined CIHA in 1991 when Indian Housing Programs were funded under the US Housing Act of 1937 and was instrumental in the transition and implementation of programs and the accounting conversion to governmental GAAP when NAHASDA was implemented in 1997. Maria assumed many different roles within the organization on a variety of key projects to further the housing authority's business enterprises and program/ project initiatives, such as the creation of a CDFI, and creation of entities to promote the housing authority's growing rental portfolio. Today, Maria continues to be involved in Indian housing programs with the delivery of technical assistance, online and onsite training primarily in governmental accounting, financial management, and auditing. Maria graduated from the University of Alaska, Anchorage with degrees in Business Administration, Accounting (BBA), and Master of Administration (MBA).
