TRAINING

The Native American Housing Assistance and Self Determination Act of 1996 (NAHASDA) requires grantees to conduct self-monitoring as part of federal compliance. The self-monitoring process helps the grantee to track progress and demonstrate accountability. This training will use exercises, and HUD Office of Native American Programs (ONAP) monitoring plans and checklists to show participants how to tell the differences between performance and compliance monitoring, observe and track activities, identify deficiencies and take steps to correct these, and appropriately record and report findings.
